#### **Ikenobo Workshop**

For the benefit of our new members, we will do a traditional shoka arrangement using one material. This will be good review for more experienced members. Since it is the season of chrysanthemum, we will use this flower as they are readily available. You may want to call your local florist to reserve some.

#### **Please bring:**

- Shoka type container or wide, shallow bowl or compote. Kenzan should sit no more than 2 inches below the rim of the container.
- Kenzan (at least 3" diameter)
- 5 to 7 fuji mums (all one color)
- Hasami or floral shears
- Bucket for floral materials
- Towel for clean up
- Newspaper or plastic to cover work area
- Camera to capture your finished arrangement



Guests may participate in workshops for a \$10 lesson fee or may observe for \$2.
